SEQ Overview

South East Queensland (SEQ) is a globally competitive, fast-growing region offering great lifestyles. Approximately 75,000 new residents are expected to call SEQ home each year as the region's population grows from 3.8 million in 2022 to 5.44 million in 2041.


SEQ is expected to add 794,000 new dwellings between 2016 and 2041, with 60% added by consolidation, rather than expansion.



Population Growth

SEQ Population increased from 3.49 million in 2016 to over 3.8 million in 2020 with an annual growth rate of 2.1%. It is projected to grow to over 5.44 million in 2041, an increase of 1.65 million residents or 43.4% growth since 2020.

SEQ Population is 3,817,573 as of 30 June 2021 with 0.91% growth on previous year, with Greater Brisbane only 0.73%



QLD Capital Program 2022

In 10 years QLD will be hosting the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games and the state will be well on its way to securing its future as a renewable energy superpower, generating 50 per cent of its electricity from renewables. The QLD Government are investing over \$50B in infrastructure over 4 years from 2021-22.



An independent economic assessment by KPMG has indicated the Games will deliver a total benefit of \$8.1 billion for Queensland, and \$17.61 billion for Australia. Overall, it will cost almost \$7 billion to run the games, which will be privately funded, averaging \$800 million to \$1.1 billion per year between 2027 and 2030.

The Venue Master Plan identifies 37 competition venues required for hosting 28 Olympic and 22 Paralympic sports. The master plan comprises six new venues, eight upgraded venues and 23 existing or temporary venues.




